Whereas a certain tract of five hundred acres of land or thereabouts situate in Limerick Township in the County of Philadelphia adjoining the lands of Richard Haines and Company and Isaac Norris Esq^r was heretofore surveyed and returned for our use and we afterward granted about one hundred and fifty acres thereof unto the said Isaac Norris; And John Acker of the said County hath now applied to purchase of us Two hundred acres of the remainder; But the survey of the said Tract being mislaid and not now to be found These are therefore to require you to resurvey or cause to be resurveyed the whole remainder of the said five hundred acres tract and lay out for the said John Acker his said proposed quantity thereof in such manner as not to prejudice or deprive the residue of its proportionable part of the water, meadowing and Timber and for your so doing this shall be your sufficient Warrant: Given under my hand and the seal of the Land Office, by virtue of certain powers from the said Proprietaries at Philadelphia this twenty-first day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand ^{seven} hundred and sixty-one.
