

But as I had a letter of William Parsons I intended to send them to him however as he has resigned shall say what is necessary here; First ~~not~~ no Lots shall be more than 60 ft. Eight Lots of 60 ft in each square where there is now ten, in the plan sent me which will make the Lots of 315 ft in this place but 230 ft which we think long enough for any purposes; let the Main Street intended for the Market & Public Buildings be 160 ft instead of 130 ft wide for the length of two squares as in the plan & the Length of 230 ft on that Street also then there will be 32 Lots of equal dimensions excepting that the 4 Corner Lots should be taken of 30 ft each that there may be room enough to build a Court House when there shall be occasion, which will make a square in the Centre of 200 ft by 220 ft for a Court House or any other public building from whence other buildings or a Market might run each way the length of 520 ft & have 160 ft for the breadth of it The streets marked 80 ft we approve of & that marked 66 ft we would have 60 ft The alleys 20 ft as propos'd. We shant grant any four or five acre Lots but on lease for 2 y^{rs} at a reasonable Rent & any Timber on them useful for building should be valued.
