



Surveyed and laid out the 20th day of October 1730 unto William Allen of the City of Philadelphia Esquire a Tract of Land situate near Oley in the County of Philadelphia beginning at a Hickery tree on the Bank of the River Schuylkill at a corner Peter Robeson's land then by the same north thirty degrees east two hundred and seventy two perches to a hickery sapplin then south sixty degrees east by a line of trees two hundred thirty eight perches to a post Thence by Mordecai Lincoln's land south twenty three degrees west two hundred twenty six perches to a hickery on the bank of the said River at a corner of the said Lincoln's land then up the several courses of the said River two hundred seventy four perches to the place of beginning containing three hundred fifty nine acres with allowance of six & Cent.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this twelfth day of July 190.
