



Surveyed this tract of land to William Allon upon the West Branch of Dalawar below Moors place beginning at a marked ches not standing by the side of the said Branch then south east Three hundred and forty pearch by vacand land to a black oak marked then northeast one hundred and thirty-eight pearches to a black oak then north sixty-nine degrees east two hundred and six pearches to another black oak then northeast eighty-eight pearch to a heap of stones then south east one hundred and seventy pearch to a post by the side of the west branch all by vacand land then upp the severall courses of the said branch to the place of beginning, containing five hundred acres of land with usual allowance for Roads surveyed in Bucks County on the 14 day of the 7 month in the yeare 1733
