



By vertue of a war^t from Edward Penington Survey^r Generall beareing date the 10th day of the 12th m^o 170^o directed unto me I do hereby certefy into his office that I have reasurveyd the 16th of ye same month unto Edward Reese a certaine tract of land in the City Liberty of Philadelphia — begineing at a stake in by frankford Roade from thenc by an ould line of marked trees deviding it from Thomas flairemans and Neals Nealson's land north north west 248 perches from thenc west south west by an ould line of marked trees 158 perches to a black oke saplin-marked from thenc south south east by an ould line of marked trees 240 perches from thenc east north east 34 to a w^t oke marked from thenc south southeast 32 perches to a black oke marked by the said Roade thenc north 60 degrees east ~~78~~ 78 perches thenc north 48 degrees east 48 perches to the place of begineing containeing 254 acres & 120 perches.
