



By virtue of a warrant from the Proprietaries dated the second day of September 1734 surveyed unto George March a tract of land situate in New Cowissihoppin in ye County of Philada^a begining at a post in a line of Christo^t Smith's land thence by the same south west one hundred perches and by vacant land ye same course ninety six perches to a post thence by vacant land north west one hundred and three perches to a post thence by vacant land north east one hundred & one perches to a post thence by vacant land north west eleven perches to a hickery thence north east by vac^t land ninety five perches to a white oak a corner of Thomas Hammonds land thence by ye same south east one hundred & fourteen perches to ye place of begining containing one hundred and twenty five acres with ye usual allowance of six $\frac{1}{2}$ cent.
