



A Draught of a tract of land situate in Springtown Manor in the County of Chester now in the possession of William Mackey beginning at a post on the North side of Indian Creek a branch of Brandywine thence by land of Andrew Willson North 86 perches to a stone thence by the same and land of John McFeefer N. 6° W. 70 1/2 perches to a stone thence by said McFeefers N. 58° E. 75 perches to a Poplar and N. 66 1/2 E. 31 perches to a stone thence by Thomas Canady's land S. 49° E. 119 perches to a marked black oak thence by land of Margaret Elliot, Widow S. 14° W. 79 perches to a marked white oak S. 36° W. 60 perches to a marked white oak & S. 46° W. 71 perches to a marked Maple standing on the North side of 5d Creek thence up the same on the several courses thereof to the beginning containing one hundred & ninety acres & one quarter of an acre and the allowance of six feet for Roads &c. Surveyed the 29th day ^{of} September 1753, by direction of the Hon'ble the Proprietaries.
