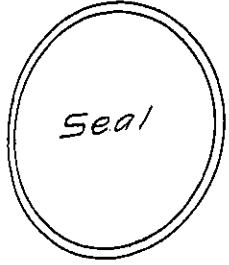

William Penn Absolute Proprietary & Govern^r in Chief of
the Province of Pensilvania and Counties annexed.

Whereas there was a Mannor formerly laid out for me and my
heirs in the County of Chester by the name of Springtown, of w^{ch} the
lands in the sd County are generally held but has since been sur-
vey'd and disposed of to others, so that there is now no such Mannor
in being to ground the sd Tenures on.

These are therefore to require thee forthwith to survey and lay
out or cause to be laid out ten thousand acres in one tract the nearest
of land unsurvey'd in the County of Chester to be erected into a
Mannor and called by the name of Springtown aforesaid and make
returns thereof into my Secretaries office.

Given under my hand and seal at Philadi^a the 6th day of
the first month 170⁹.
