Begining and cornering w<sup>th</sup> a corner stone on ye west of ye sd lott in ye line between Jn<sup>o</sup> White's land & ye lott above mentioned, thence by a due East course eighty perches to a corner stone thence due North eighty perches to a corner stone thence by a due West course ~~to~~ eighty perches to a corner stone in ye sd line between Jn<sup>o</sup> Whites & ye common lott <sup>as</sup> affsd, seventy eight perches. South from ye street line so call'd thence South eighty perches to ye place of begining. The Tract of land <sup>above mentioned</sup> being <sup>out</sup> lay'd <sub>Δ</sub> by order of ye preparative meeting of Nottingham. By
