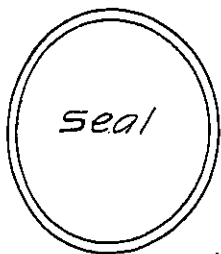


Pennsylvania Ss.



By the Proprietaries

Whereas a strip of land lying on the Westerly side of the River Schuylkill of fifteen hundred perches long between Richard Pikes land and divers purchasers under use in Charlestown Township in the County of Chester was surveyed and returned for our use into your office in the year 1743 and some part thereof hath been since sold by us to several persons and divers persons having now applied to purchase of us the remainder of the said tract. These are to require you forthwith to make return of the survey of the said strip of land together with a copy of the Draught into our Secretary's office for our use therein distinguishing the parts thereof already sold and surveyed and for your so doing this shall be your Warrant. Given under my hand and the Seal of the Land Office by vertue of certain powers from the said Proprietaries, at Philadelphia this eighth day of March Anno
