

Pennsylvania 5.5

In pursuance of a Warrant dated the 29th day of October 1743 there was surveyed to David Kennedy a tract of land situate in Londonderry Township in the County of Chester beginning at a marked Chesnut tree in a line of other land of the said David Kennedy's and from thence extending by the same North fifteen Pegrees West fifty eight perches to a post, thence by James Griswell's land North East by North one hundred and four perches to a marked white oak, East South East forty eight perches to a marked Spanish oak, and East by North six perches to a marked black oak thence by William Love's land South fifteen degrees West seventy three perches to a marked hickery, thence by Samuel Blair's land South fifteen degrees East fifty seven perches to a marked white oak thence by James Gillelan's land Ninety perches to the place of beginning containing sixty three acres and a half and the usual allowance of six acres $\frac{1}{4}$ Ct for Roads &c. Returned into the Secretary's Office the 31st day of August An—Dom—1750
