

By virtue of a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property dated the 18th day of the 3^d month 1703 for surveying unto Charles Whitacre a certain parcel of land within the bounds of the tract formerly laid out to Griffith Jones in Westtown in the County of Chester to the quantity of three or four hundred acres for which he hath agreed to pay thirty five pounds for every hundred.

Survey'd and laid out the 11th day of October 1703 four hundred acres of land to the Charles Whitacres situuate in Willistown in the County of Chester beginning at a spanish oak in the line of oblique ^{Edgmont township} ~~Bishop's farm~~ thence north fifty five degrees West by vacant land one hundred and sixty perches to a black oak then by vacant land North four degrees east ninety perches to a spanish oak then by ~~the~~ the line of the Indians land South forty eight degrees east one hundred and ninety three perches to a black oak then by the said Indians land North forty two degrees east two hundred eighty three perches to a post thence North forty eight degrees West two hundred and eighty three perches to a post then North twenty four degrees west thirty four perches to a post then North sixty six degrees East by Sam' Lewis his land one hundred and thirty five perches to a black oak then by the lands of Thomas Massey Peter Thomas and Francis Yarnel South twenty four degrees east four hundred and fifty perches to the stump of a tree then by the line of Edgmont township South sixty six degrees west three hundred and twenty perches to the place of beginning.
