By vertue of severall Warrs from the Proprietary & Govern<sup>t</sup>  
dated yesterday, directed to me, to survey or cause to be surveyed,  
unto Thomas Calvert, three hundred acres, and next to John  
Calvert three hundred acres, next unto Margret & Elizabeth  
Calvert two hundred acres, & these to joyne all one unto an-  
other, and next to them to Robert Robinson three hundred  
acres & next to Georg- Whiteside, Georg- Reed & Thomas  
Childs three hundred acres, all these the Govern<sup>t</sup> hath prom-  
ised to lye together. Unto Nathaniel Evans three hundred acres  
all renters, and all in the next townshipp to that called Concord  
in ye County of Chester, and according to the method appointed  
by the Govern<sup>t</sup> always observing for the future that the latter  
or further moyety on both sides of the street in every townshipp  
be reserved for the purchasers not yet come into ye province.  
I therfore hereby authorize thee to survey & set out unto the said  
persons their lands respectively as above exprest & make me a  
true returne of the originall field works & protracted figures of  
every townshipp & the names of every ~~ff~~ son seated therein & their  
distinct quantities of lands, which by my pattern are to remain
