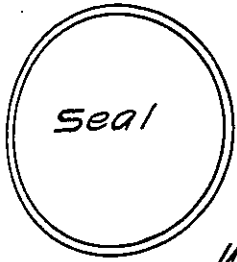

Whereas by virtue of a Warrt from the Proprietary dated ye 2^d day of 7^{br} 1700. There was surveyed and laid out to Thomas Pierce purchaser of one thousand acres ^{of land} in right ^{as} & part of the said purchase the quantity of ffive hundred acres in that tract called Limrick township in the County of Philad^a since which sd survey James Shattick of the said County hath purchased the whole said one thousand acres and thereupon represents to us that the said ffive hundred acres laid out in Limrick proves so very near stony & barren that it will hardly sell for any consideration worth the m^ony he has laid out for ye purchase thereof and therefore hath besought us that he might resigne & throw up the said ffive hundred acres and instead thereof ^{that we would} grant him the like quantity to be taken up in some other place of the Province. These are ^{the same} to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd unto the said James Shattick according to the method of townships appointed in the said Province the said quantity of ffive hundred acres of land that hath not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians & make returns thereof into the Secretary's office in order for a further confirmation.
