Pursuant to a warrant under the hands of the Commiss<sup>o</sup>bl. of Property and the seal of the Province bearing date the 8<sup>th</sup> day of x<sup>br</sup> 1701 granting unto John Morris a survey on five hundred acres of land part of two thousand five hundred acres by him bought of Thom<sup>s</sup> ffairman who purchased of Thomas Hartley his right to five thousand acres originally purchased of the Prop<sup>r</sup>

There is surveyd and laid out to Jn<sup>o</sup> Morris a tract of land iobl. the County ~~County~~ of Philadelphia beginning at a stake in obl. line of <sup>Robert</sup> ~~Thomas~~ ffairman's land and at a corner of other lanobl. the said Jn<sup>o</sup> Morris from thence extending by the said Morris's laobl. North West five hundred perches to other land of the said John Morris from thence South West one hundred and sixty perches thence South east by the said Morris his land five hundred perches to the said ffairman's land and by the same North east one hund<sup>d</sup> and sixty perches to the place of beginning containing five hundred acres surveyd by David Powel the 23<sup>d</sup> of 10<sup>br</sup> 1701.
