By the Commissioners of Property.

At the request of James Shattick and Edward Lane of the County of Philad'lia that we would grant them to take up four hundred and eighty acres of land remaining untaken up of one thousand acres originally purchased by Richard Pearce ^{of Lymerick in} the Kingdom of Ireland to which thousand acres they have now purchased the whole right.

These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd to the said James Shattick and Edward Lane according to the method of townships appointed the said quantity of four hundred and eighty acres of land in this Province that has not been already taken up nor is conceal'd nor seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretaries office.

Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the twenty sixth day of the second month (April) in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eight, and in the seventh of the Reign of our Sovereign Lady Anne of Great Britain & Queen
