By the Commissioners of Property

At the request of James Shattick and Edward Lane of the County of Philadelphia that we would grant them to take up ^{of} four hundred and eighty acres of land remaining untaken up one thousand acres originally purchased by John Phelps of Lymerick in Ireland to which said thousand acres they have now purchased the whole right.

These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd to the said James Shattick and Edward Lane according to the method of townships appointed the said quantity of four hundred and eighty acres of land in this Province that has not been already taken up nor is concealed nor seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretaries office.

Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the twenty sixth day of the second month (called April) in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eight and in the seventh year of the reign of our Sovereign Lady Anne of Great Britian &c. Queen.
