

Pensylvania Ss.

By the Commissioners of Property.

At the request of Evan Owen of Philadelphia that we would grant him a certain vacant Lot situate on the West side of <sup>the</sup> third street ~~from~~ from Delaware between the North end of the Lot late Griffith Jones's and George Harmer's Lot being in front about thirty one foot and extending in depth from the said third street to friends Burying Grounds for which he agrees to pay down to the use of the Proprietary Trustees ten pounds money of Pensylvania and the yearly Quitrent of one shilling sterling for the same also the said Evan Owen requests the grant of a small vacancy of about four five or six foot broad left untaken up between the Lot of George Harmer and the Lot late of Francis Plumsted on the North side of the High street for which he agrees to pay to the use of the said Trustees the further sum of five pounds of like money of Pensylvania.

These are to authorize and require thee to survey and lay out unto the said Evan Owen the above described lot of ground and also the ~~vacancy~~ small vacancy if there to be found and make exact returns of both into the Secretary's office in order for a further confirmation.


A true copy

By virtue of the aforesaid warrant I survey'd to the said Evan Owen on the first day of February Anno — 1719, the Lot above mentioned bounded on the East with the said third street <sup>the south with the</sup> late of Griffith <sup>and</sup> John Day on the West with friends burying Ground and on the North with a <sup>lot</sup> formerly laid out to George Harmer being in breadth on the said third street thirty one foot and in length ninety eight foot.

Also the small vacancy aforesaid in the said High street being in breadth six foot and in length three hundred and six foot bounded on the East with the Francis Plumstends Lot on the South with the said High street on the West with George Harmer's lot and on the North with back Lots returned into the Secretary's Office eighth of March Anno — 1719
