I should willingly agree to this Proposal for running the fence near the Run in my Pasture were it not for these reasons Thou sees I was at the Charge of running a fence all those 40 Poles parallel & near to Spring Garden fence, which was solely to accommodate the upper pieces especially that above Spring Garden with a watering place that the Creatures coming down that narrow Lane might have the benefit of the Run, but the Line now proposed intirely excludes me from that benefit. again If the fence is to ~~be~~ be carried nearly the same course with the Run, ~~the Posts~~ & cross it twice, the Posts <sup>must</sup> probably be placed in the Water w<sup>ch</sup> will be exceedingly inconvenient. but by crossing it directly or nearly at right angles this is prevented, and lastly thy proposal leaves so little of the Run to the Mammor that it is of very little importance to it, however,

that I may not be thought desirous to engross Conveniencies to my self, tho on my Application to the Proprietor, (for I never in my life would ask or take any thing from the Commissioners) he actually granted it to me, Yet I am willing the fence should begin ~~between~~ between my gate & the Run to leave out some of it towards the Road, but as the Water is my right all the way I can by no means part with it at the farther end. Pray let it be dispatched & ~~and~~ tell J. Steel that I pray him also to expedite the Patent. My Right is 32 Acres, but I have lost one of them in the Road I am Thy obliged friend
