



By virtue of a Warr<sup>t</sup> from the Commiss<sup>rs</sup> of Property dated the 6<sup>th</sup> of March 1717/8 for Surveying unto Herrman Casdrop (since deceased) a Tract of Land Situate on y<sup>e</sup> West Side of the River Skuy Hill & called Turkey point, Survey'd unto Jacob Casdrop, son of the sd Herrman on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of March 1734, The afd Tract of Land Situate in the County of Chester, Beginning at a Black Oak by the S<sup>d</sup> River at a corner of Isaac Opthegraff's Land, thence South West by the Same and the Land of Christopher Spreighter & Casper Mingle 430 pches to a Hickery, thence North West by the Land of John Garber & Jacob Erger 224 pches to a post thence North East by the Land of Jacob Steager 152 pches to a White oak by the S<sup>d</sup> River then down the Same on the Several Courses thereof 863 pches to the place of Beginning Containing Six Hundred acres & the allowance of Six p Cent
