



By Virtue of a Warrant from y^e Commiss^{rs} of Property bearing date the 19th of the 11th month 1702 for Resurveying unto Thomas Cartwright two several parcels of Land Situate in the efforts of Chester Creek in the County of Chester Originally laid out to John Priestner, One of the s^d parcels of Land was Resurveyd for William Fatten on the 8th day of June 1703. By Isaac Taylor Surveyor of the s^d County, Beginning at a Corner marked Ash Tree Standing by a branch of Chester Creek, at a corner of Gilbert Wooliam's land thence down the s^d branch on the Several Courses thereof 238 perches to the s^d Creek then up the same 18 perches to a post thence S. 64 degrees West by y^e Land of Thomas Cartwright 190 perches to a Hickery. thence South 35^d East by the s^d Gilbert Wooliam's land 145 pches to the place of Beginning Containing one Hundred & ffifteen acres
