Whereas the Members of the free Society of Traders in Pensilvania having purchased Twenty Thousand Acres of Land in this Province Our late proprietary & Govern<sup>r</sup> William Penn Esq<sup>r</sup> Granted them his Warrant Dated the Twenty Sixth day of the Twelfth Month 1682 directed to the then Survey<sup>r</sup> Gen<sup>l</sup> Requiring him to cause the same to be Survey'd or laid <sup>out</sup> to the said Society By vertue whereof some part of the sd Land was Survey'd and the Residue remains Untocated, And whereas by an Act of Gen<sup>l</sup> Assembly of this province All the sd Lands with the Appurtenances are vested & Settled in us as Trustees with power to sell the same for the use of the sd Society And we having Sold to Robert Jones of Mirion Township in the County of Philad<sup>a</sup> Gen<sup>t</sup> Three hundred acres of the sd Unto- cated Land And in pursuance of the directions of the sd Act of Assembly have Settled & Adjusted in the Survey<sup>r</sup> Gen<sup>l</sup>'s Office of this province the True Acco<sup>t</sup> of the Lands Already Survey'd and laid out in Right of the sd Society & Secured the payment of the Arrears of Quitments due for the same to the Proprietor of this Province . . . . These are therefore to Request Thee in pursuance of the sd Original Warrant of the Said late proprietary and by the Authority of the sd Act of Gen<sup>l</sup> Assembly to Survey or Cause to be Survey'd unto the sd Robert Jones Accordind to the Establashed and Usual Methods heretofore practised for taking up of Lands in this Province and not Other- wise the sd Quantity of three hundred Acres and make Returns thereof to the sd Survey<sup>r</sup> Gen<sup>l</sup>'s office Given under our hands & Seals at Philad<sup>a</sup> the Eighteenth day of No- vember Anno<sup>m</sup> Dom - 1724
