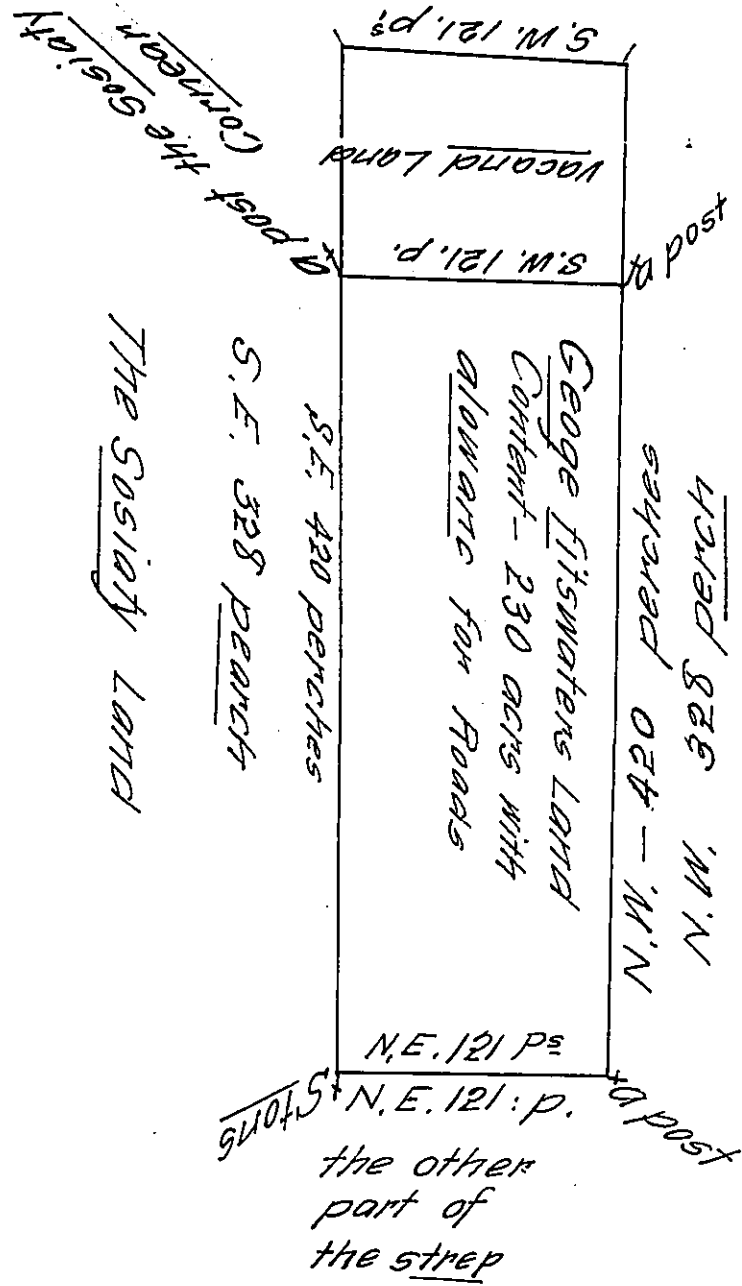

Surveyed this Tract of land to Gorge Fitzwater By virtue of a warrant bearing date february the 15 1724/5 and by an order to me directed from Jacob Taylor beginning at the upper corner of the society land then by the same South East three hundred and twenty Eight perches to a heap of stons at Jeremiah Langhorns Corner then North East by the same one hundred and twenty one perch to a post then North West three hundred and twenty Eight perches to a post by Crestforth Days and Sephes Childs Land then South West one hundred and twenty one perch by vacant Land to the place of beginning Containing two hundred and thirty acres with allowance for Roads By me 1733 May the 28th
