Whereas the Members of the free Society of Traders in Pennsil-
vania Having purchased Twenty Thousand Acres of land in
this Province Our late proprietary & Govern^r William Penn Esq^r
Granted them his Warrant Dated the twenty sixth day of the
Twelfth month 1682 directed to the then Survey^r Gen^l Requir-
ing him to cause the same to be Survey'd or Lay'd out to
the s^d Society by vertue whereof some part of the s^d Land
was Survey'd and the residue remains Unlocated, And where-
as by an act of Gen^l Assembly of this Province All the s^d
Lands with the Appurtenances are vested & settled in us
as Trustees with Power to sell the same for the use of the
s^d Society and we having sold to John Taylor of the County of
Chester Gen^r four hundred Acres of the s^d Unlocated Land
and in pursuance of the s^d Act of assembly have Setled & ad-
justed in the Survey^r General's office of this Province the True Acct^t
of the Lands already Survey'd & laid out in Right of the s^d
Society and secured the payment of the arrears of Quitrents
due for the same to the Proprietor of this Province - - - - -
These are therefore to require thee in pursuance of the afores^d
Original Warrant of the s^d Late Proprietary and by the author-
ity of the s^d Act of Gen^l Assembly to Survey or cause to be Sur-
vey'd unto the s^d John Taylor According to the Established &
Usual Methods heretofore practised for Taking up of Lands in
this Province and not otherwise the s^d Quantity of four hundred
Acres and make Returns thereof into the s^d Surveyor Gen^l's
office Given under our hands & seals at Philad^a the Twelfth
day of January - - - Anno DOM - 1724
