Whereas the Members of the free Society of Traders in Pensilvania having purchased Twenty thousand Acres of Land in this Province Our late Proprietary and Govern^r William Penn Esq^r Grant^d them his Warrant dated the Twenty Sixth day of the Twelfth Month 1682 directed to the then Survey^r Gen^l requiring him to cause y^e same to be Survey'd or laid out to the sd Society By virtue whereof some part of the sd Land was survey'd and the Residue remains unlocated - And Whereas by an Act of Gen^l Assembly of this Province all the sd Lands With the Appurtenances are vested and settled in us as Trustees with Power to sell the same for y^e Use of y^e sd Society And we having sold to Matthew Hughs of Bucks County One hundred Acres - of the sd unlocated Land and in pursuance of the Directions of the sd Act of Assembly have settled & adjusted in the Survey^r Gen^l's office of this Province the true Acco^t of the Lands already Survey'd and laid out in Right of the sd Society and secured the Payment of y^e arrears of Quitrents due for the same to the Proprietor of this Province - These are therefore to request thee in pursuance of the aforesaid Original Warrant of the sd late Proprietary and by the Authority of the sd Act of General Assembly to Survey or cause to be survey'd unto the sd Matthew Hughs - according to the Established and Usual Methods heretofore practised for taking up of Lands in this Province and not otherwise the said quantity of One hundred - - - acres and make return thereof into the sd Survey^r General's office. Given under our hands and seals at Philadelphia the twenty fifth Day of March Anno-Dom- 1724.
