

In Pursuance of a Warrant under the hands and Seals of Charles Read Job Goodson George ffitzwater and Joseph Pidgeon Trustees for the ffree Society of Traders in Pensilvania dated the twenty fifth day of March in the year 1724 Requiring me to Survey (or cause to be Surveyed) to James Steel ffive hundred acres of Land in this Province in part of 2000 acres purchased by the said Society Certified that ^{the} seventeenth day of April in the same year there was Survey'd to the Said James Steel a Certain Tract of Land in the Township of Warminster in the County of Bucks Beginning at a Black oak in a line of a piece of Land Reputed Jasper Lawrence's land and Running South West by the Land now or late of Joseph Todd three hundred thirty two perches to a post Then North West by Henry Cornely's land and other land two hundred and three perches Then North East by a Line of trees three hundred thirty two perches Then South East by the Said Jasper Lawrence his land two hundred and three perches to the place of Beginning Containing four hundred acres Survey'd in part of the said five hundred and Returned into the Secretary's Office the 30th day of April 1724
