Upon an agreement made with Casper Wister of the City of Philadelphia for two thousand acres of Land to be laid out amongst the late Surveys made back in the said Province, for twelve hundred acres whereof the said Casper has already pass'd his Bills of Exchange for One hundred thirty three Pounds Six Shillings & eight pence <sup>sterling</sup> payable to the Proprietary Trustees - In London and for the Eight hundred acres he now agrees to pay to the Use of the said Prop<sup>rs</sup> Trustees One hundred & twenty Eight pounds Money of Pennsylvania [in Gold] and the Yearly quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for every hundred acres of the whole. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said Casper Wister back in the said Province in three or four parcels) According to the Method of Townships Appointed the Said quantity of two thousand acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys office which Survey in case the said Casper Wister shall pay down the said One hundred and twenty eight pounds in Gold within three Month after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted Given under our hands & the lesser Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>a</sup> the 30<sup>th</sup> of y<sup>e</sup> 11<sup>th</sup> Month Anno Din 1728/9
