



By the Proprietors of the Province
of Pensilvania

At the Request of Casper Wister of the City of Philadelphia
(by his friend James Steel) that we would grant him to take up within
the said Province the quantity of three hundred & fifty acres of Land
for which he agrees to pay Sixteen Pounds Money of Pensilvania [in
Gold] and the Yearly quitrent of One Shilling Sterling for each hun-
dred acres and in proportion for the fifty acres. These are to
authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto
the said Casper Wister among the late Surveys made back in
the said Province the said quantity of three hundred & fifty acres
of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seat-
ed by the Indians and Make Returne thereof into the Secretarys
Office, which Survey in case the said Casper Wister fulfill the above
agreement upon the Returne of Survey to be made by Vertue hereof
shall be Valid: otherwise the Same is to be Void as if it had never been
made nor this warrant ever granted Given under our hands and
the Lesser Seal of the s^d Province Dated at London the 23 day of
April Anno Domini 1730
