 By virtue of two Warrants from the Proprietors both dated the 23^d day of April 1730 for Surveying to Caspar Wister two thousand acres of Land in the Province of Pensilvania There was Surveyed in part on the 22^d of February 1730¹ a Tract of land on a branch of Schuytkil called Maxatwry in the County of Philadelp. beginning at a black oak at corner of Other land of the said Caspar Thence by the same North ten degrees West one hundred forty eight perches to a post Then by Vacant land as follows to say North eighty degrs East three hundred and fifteen perches to a post North ten degrs ^{West} seventy two perches to a hickry North eighty degree East one hundred and sixty perches to a post South ten degrs East one hundred and thirty Perches to a hickry North eighty degrees East one hundred and twenty perches to a Chestnut South ten degrees East two hundred and thirteen perches to a hickry South eighty degrees West one hundred & twenty perches and North ten West one hundred twenty three perches to a small hickry Then by Vacant land and the said Caspar's other land South eighty degrees West four hundred seventy five^{per} to the place of Beginning Containing six hundred and thirty three acres with allowance of Six p Cent —Certified by
