his Heirs and Assigns One thousand Acres of the said
Land in some one place on Land purchased of the Indians,
and whereon no persons are seated Receiving a Quitrent
of twelve pence the Hundred Acres, Given under our hands
and the Lesser Seal of the Said province, at London this
12th day of May 1732*
