ed of us Ten thousand Acres of Land in our said prov-
ince of Pensilvania We do hereby Authorize & Require
you to survey or Cause to be surveyed, to him the said
Thomas Freame his Heirs & Assigns One thousand
Acres of the said Land in some one place on Land pur-
chased of the Indians & whereon no persons are Seated
Reserving a Quitrent of twelve pence ^{hundred} the Acres Given
under our hands and the Lesser Seal of the said prov-
ince, at London this 12th day of May 1732.
