

Pennsylvania 5.5.

By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of James Steel that we would Grant him to take up the Lot of Ground in the City of Philadelphia and the Liberty Land in the Liberties thereof appurtenant to the Original Purchase of two hundred & fifty Acres of Land made of the Propr. by Joseph and Daniel Milner late of the County of Bucks Decd. and also the proportion of Liberty Land appurtenant to the Original purchase of five hundred Acres made of ye Proprietr. by Edward Bezer late of the County of Chester Deced. The right to both which Said proportions of Liberty Land and ye Lot of Ground being ^{now} vested in the said James Steel.

These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the Said James Steel in ye back Streets of ye Said City of Philada. the Said Lot of Ground proportionable to the said purchase and also in the Liberties of ye Said City the Liberty Land belonging to the Said two purchases [if there to be found vacant] being in ye whole twelve acres, if on this side the River Schuykill @ or fifteen acres if on ye west side of that River and make exact Returns of the whole into the Secretarys office in order for a further Confirmation. Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 21st day of the 3^d Month Anno Dni. 1719.
