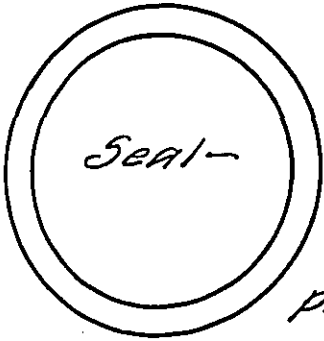


Pennsylvania s. s.



By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of James Steel That we would grant him to take up within the City of Philadelphia the Lot of ground belonging to five hundred Acres of Land the Original purchase of Thomas Zachary made of the late Proprietary and the Liberty Land appurtenant to the same purchase in the Liberties of the said City and also the Liberty Land belonging to five hundred <sup>acres</sup> the original purchase of Walter Martin late of Chester County Deed. The Right to the said Lot & Liberty Lands being now vested in the said James Steel. These are to Authorize & Require thee to Survey & lay out unto the said James Steel in the said City the aforesaid Lot of Ground in proportion to ye purchase, and in the Liberties, the Liberty Land belonging to the two purchases aforesaid. and make Returns thereof into the Secretary's Office in order for a further Confirmation. Given under our hands & the lesser Seal of ye Province at Philadelphia the 1st day of ye 2d. Month 1721.
