

Surveyd and Laid out the 12th day of December 1718 by a Warrt from the Commissioners Dated the first Day of Septemr. in the same year unto James Steel of Philadelphia Gent a Certain Tract of Land in the County of Philadelphia. Containing five hundred acres with the Common Allowa^{n^{ce}} of six acres p cent being one Moiety of the quantity mention'd in the said Warrant.

Beginning at^a Corner post in the in the Bounds of Francis Daniel Pastorius Land and Running by the same North West one hundred ninety four perches to a white Oak. Then South West by a Line of Marked trees four hundred and forty perches to a white Oak. Then South East by a Line of Marked trees One hundred ~~9~~ ninety four perches to a Corner Post Then North West by a line of Marked trees four hundred and forty perches to the place of Beginning.

Returned into the Secretary's Office the 22^d Day of December 1718. This 500 is now Included in a Larger Tract and this Return is useless J. Taylor.
