



By virtue of a warrant from John Estough Attorney to the London Land Company I survey'd to Edward Farmer Esqr. a Certain Tract of Land Scituate on the River Schuikil and Perqueoman Creek in the County of Philadelphia. Beginning at a Corner Marked Spanish Oak. Standing on the North East Side of the sd. River Schuikil being a Corner of Daniel Flaxony's. Land Thence North by the same Land twenty five Perches to a Post thence North West by a line of Marked Trees three Hundred Perches to the sd. Perqueoman Creek. Thence Down the same fifty Perches to the sd. River. Schuikil. Thence Down the same Traversing the several Courses thereof to the Place of Beginning Containing five Hundred Acres.

Survey'd the 20th of November 1716. p Isaac Taylor.
