 140 pches to a black Oak Thence N. E. by the Land of Thomas Cart-
 mell 115 pches to a Chusnut Thence S. E. by the same Land 196
 pches to a Chusnut Thence S. W. by the same Land 80 pches
 to a white Oak Thence S. E. by Vacant Land 150 pches to a white
