



Pursuant to two Warrants from the Commissioners I surveyd to Thomas Griffiths of Philadelphia Gent. a certain tract of land lying on Shickasellunga Creek in ye County of Chester begining at a corner marked hickery tree standing on ye Western side of ye sd Creek thence South East by South by a line of marked trees 428 perches to a hickery tree by the road that goes to Suatorah thence South West 503 perches to a B.O. thence N.N.W. 15 perches to a hickery thence W. S.W. 109 perches to a post thence N.W. by N. 408 perches to a B.O. thence E. N. E. 188 to a wallnut tree by a big Run thence N.N.W. 90 perches to a B.Oak thence North East by East 363 perches to a White oak thence N. by East 46 perches to the place of begining containing 1500 acres w<sup>th</sup> ye usual allowance of 6 perches
