

Pensilvania 5s.



By the Commissioners of Property

At the request of Thomas Griffits that we would grant him to take up among the late surveys made back in this Province the quantity of one thousand acres of land in one or more parcels for which he agrees to pay to the use of the Trustees within six months after the date hereof one hundred pounds money of Pensilvania for the whole and the yearly quitrent of one shilling sterling for every hundred acres thereof.

These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd unto the said Thomas Griffits according to the method of townships appointed (in one or more parcels among the said late surveys) the said quantity of one thousand acres of land that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretarys office which survey in case the sd Thomas — fulfill the above agreem^t shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this Warr^t ever granted. Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philadelphia ye 20th day of Decemb^r Anno Dni 1718
