These are to authorize and require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be survey'd unto Isaac Norris of Fair Hill Esq<sup>r</sup> all that Great Island lying in the River Schuylkill opposite to his Mannor of William Stadt to be holder of us our heirs and successors under the yearly quitrent of one pepper corn for the whole Island when the same shall be demanded make a true return thereof into the Secretary's office in order for confirmation for which this shall be thy sufficient Warrant.

Given under my hand and the lesser Seal at Philadelphia the 17<sup>th</sup> day of December Anno Dom<sup>i</sup>— 1733.
