



Pursuant to two Warrants from the late Com^{rs} Commissioners of Property the one dated the 20th X ber 1718 the other dated ye 10th of ye 12th mo. 1719 there being surveyd June ye 15th 1720 unto Thomas Griffiths in trust for Isaac Norris a tract of land in a place now within the County of Lancaster (then called the County of Chester) intended & supposed to contain 1500 acres besides ye allowance of six acres $\frac{1}{2}$ Cent which upon a resurvey thereof being found deficient in quantity. In pursuance of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the 19th day of 8 ber 1733 to make such addition of the adjoining lands thereto as should make up 1500 acres besides the aforesd allowance resurveyd to thesd Isaac Norris on the 31st of December 1733 the above described tract of land scituate in the County of Lancaster & to the tract formerly surveyd is now added the figure A.B.C.D. All which said tract now contains 1500^{as} besides the allowance of six acres $\frac{1}{2}$ Cent for Roads & High ways
