At the request of Thomas Shute that we would grant him to take up in the Liberties of Philadelphia the proportion of Liberty land appurtenant to ye original purchase of ffive hundred acres made of the late Proprietor by John Summers since deceased whose eldest son Richard Summers by Deed dated the 15th day of December last past granted the said Liberty Land unto the said Thomas Shute.

These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyd in right of the aforesaid purchase within the said Liberties where the same may be found vacant the said proportion of Liberty land and make returns thereof into the Secretarys office in order for a further confirmation.
