*Upon the application and request of Thomas Kirton of Speen in the County of Berks in Great Britain by his Attorney's Isaac and Charles Norris of the City of Philadelphia that we would be pleased to grant him a survey on a lot of ground within the said City and the proportion of Liberty land within the Liberties thereof appurtenant and belonging to five hundred acres of land the original purchase made of our late father William Penn Esq<sup>r</sup> since deceased, by Thomas Sanders then of Ilmoor in the County of Berks aforesaid also deceased, the right whereof being now vested in the said Thomas Kirton*

*These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed unto the said Thomas Kirton within the said City where the same fell by allotment or as near thereunto as may be now found vacant, the aforesaid lot of ground, and within the Liberties of the same, to survey the proportion of Liberty land belonging to the said purchase, and make returns thereof into our Secretary's office in order for confirmation and in so doing this shall be thy sufficient Warrant.
