


Pensilvania S.S.



By the Proprietaries.

At the Request of James Steel of the City
of Philadelphia That we would be pleased
to Grant him a Survey on Two hundred
Acres of Land in Right and in part of the
Original Grant of Five thousand Acres made by our late
Father William Penn Esqr. unto John Ap. John & Thomas
Wynn under whom the said James Steel derives his
Right to the said Two hundred Acres. These are to
Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be
Survey'd unto the said James Steel According to the
Method of Townships appointed the Quantity of Two
hundred Acres of Land and make Returne thereof
into our Secretary's Office in order for Confirmation
and for which this shall be thy sufficient warrant
Given under my hand and the Lesser Seal of our
Province at Philadelphia this 7th day of the 6th Month
[August] Anno Dom. 1739.
