Whereas William Allen of the ~~County~~ City of Philadelphia Esq^r hath requested that we would grant him to take up Fifty Acres of Land for the Use of the Heirs of Nathaniel Irish Esq^r deceased situate in Lower Saucon Township adjoining their other Land in the County of Bucks for which he agrees to pay to our use at the rate of Fifteen Pounds Ten Shillings, current Money of this Province for One Hundred Acres and the yearly Quit-Rent of One Half Penny Sterling for every Acre thereof

These are therefore to authorize and require you to survey or cause to be surveyed unto the said William Allen at the place aforesaid according to the method of Townships appointed, the said Quantity of Fifty Acres, if not already surveyed or appropriated and make Return thereof into the Secretaries Office, in order for further Confirmation for which this shall be your sufficient Warrant; which survey in case the said William Allen fulfil the above agreement within six months from the date hereof, shall be valid, otherwise void.
