Whereas by agreement some time since made, there was surveyed and laid out unto John Georges of the City of Philadelphia, Gent. the Quantity of One Thousand Acres of Land in two Parcels or Tracts of Five Hundred Acres each situate upon Menakasic Creek near the West Branch of the River Delaware for which he hath paid to our use the full sum of One hundred and fifty-five Pounds Current Money of this Province and is to hold the same of us our Heirs and Successors under the yearly Quitrent of One Shilling Sterling for every hundred Acres; and the said John Georges having requested that we would be pleased to issue our Warrant to establish the said surveys.

These are therefore to authorize and require thee to make returns of the said two several surveyed Tracts of Land of 500 Acres each into our Secretary's Office in order for further Confirmation and for which this shall be thy sufficient Warrant. Given under my Hand and the lesser Seal of Our Province at Philadelphia this 24<sup>th</sup> Day of February Anno Dom. 1736.
