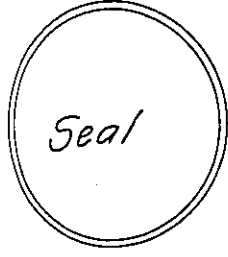

At the Request of Joseph Turner of the City of Philadelphia Merch^t That Wee would Grant him to survey and take up the City Lotts and the proportion of Liberty Land appurtein^t and belonging to the Originall purchase of five thousand acres of Land made of Our Deceased Father William Penn Esq^r by John & Ann Charlott Lowther the Right whereof being now vested in the said Joseph Turner These are to authorize & Require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd to the said Joseph Turner within the said City where the same fell by allotment the Lotts of Ground and within the Liberties of the said City y^e Proportion of Liberty Land appurtenant and belonging to the said purchase of Five thousand Acres and make returns thereof into the Secretary's Office in order for Confirmation for which this shall be thy sufficient Warrant Given under my Hand and the Lesser Seal of Our Province at Philadelphia the 31st day of Decem. Anno Dom. 1733.
