At the Request of Joseph Turner of the City of Philadelphia that we would grant him to take up y^e Quantity of Five hundred Acres of Land within Our Province in Right of the Original Grant made by Our Deceased Father to John Kirton of Kingsinton by Deeds of Lease and Release dated the 6 & 7th days of Feb. 1681 and since by other Deeds the same is now Vested in the said Joseph Turner.

These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed unto the said Joseph Turner according to the method of Townships appointed the Quantity of Four hundred ninety two acres (The proportion of Liberty Land being deducted) and make return thereof into the Secretaries Office for which this shall be thy sufficient Warr^t.
