*Surveyd and laid out to William Allen of Philadelphia Esq<sup>r</sup> a Tract of land in Oley in the County of Philadelphia beginning at a black oak sappling in a line of John Webb's land thence by the same south west sixty perches to a <sup>a W.O. at</sup> corner of the said Webb's land Then by the same southeast eighty perches to a post Then south west one hundred and forty perches to a white oak Then north west by a line of trees two hundred and thirty six perches to a white oak in a line of George Ritters land Then by the same north east two hundred perches to a post Then by vacant land southeast one hundred fifty six perches to the place of beginning containing two hundred and fifty acres with allowance of six # Cent.*
