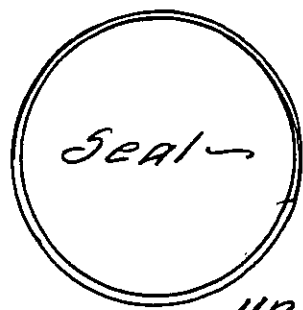


Pensilvania 5.5.



By the Proprietaries.

At the Request of James Steel of the City of Philadelphia That we would Grant him to take up the Quantity of Two hundred Acres of Land in Right of the Original purchase of Five thousand Acres made of Our late Deceased Father William Penn Esqr. by John ap, John & Thomas Wynn the Right of which said Two hundred Acres by Sundry Mesue Grants is now vested in the said James Steel. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said James Steel according to the Method of Townships Appointed the said Quantity of Two hundred Acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor Appropriated and make a Returne thereof into the Secretaries Office in order for Confirmation Given under my hand and the Lesser Seal of Our Province. at Philadelphia the Twentieth day of October Anno Dom 1733.
