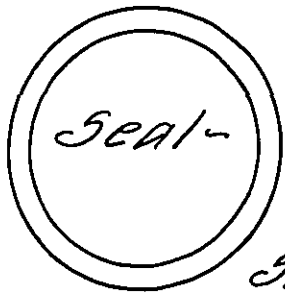


Pensilvania s. s.

Proprietrs. Use ffifteen pounds Morny of this Province

and usual quitrents of ye adjacent Lotts, These are to ^{viz three shillings sterling pr annum from ye year 1684 inclusive}

Authorize & Require thee to Survey & lay out or cause to

be Survey'd & laid out unto the said James Steel in the

places aforesaid the said Lott & Strip of Ground and make

Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office which Survey

in case the said James fulfill the above agreement

within three Months after the date hereof shall be valid

otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been

made nor this Warrant ever granted. Given under our

hands and Seal of the Province at Philada. the 18th day
